PIN DESIGN SPECIFICATIONS:

Your pin design must represent Nunavut.

Designs may be created by hand or on computer. Designs must be submitted in full colour on 8½" x 11" paper template provided and include a 1.5" x 1.5" scaled copy of the design. This assists in determining if the design can be easily replicated to a 1.5" x 1.5" sized pin.

The design may have a maximum of 3 colours plus the metal of the pin in gold or silver. Black and white are considered colours. The metal pin material is not considered one of the three colours, but will appear at the edge of your design as the boarder and the channel separating the colours throughout.

Designs **MUST** incorporate: **1) the year of the competition (2026); and 2) the words "Skills Ontario Competition" or S.O.C. and "Olympiades de Compétences Ontario" or O.C.O.** Acronyms are acceptable substitutes for spelling out the entire name of the event in both English and French. The competition is no longer called OTSC and this should not appear in your design.

Any lettering must be clearly legible at 1". A minimum of 2mm for lettering is required. Arial Narrow is the recommend font for visibility. All designs must be bilingual.

ELIGIBILITY:

ANY registered Nunavut student in secondary or post-secondary education from ANY program (does not have to be a skilled trades or technology program, could be an English or Geography student for example) may participate in this contest.



CONTEST RULES:

Only ONE pin design per student can be submitted for consideration.

All design entries must include the student's name, school name & community, teacher/advisor's name, grade/year, email and a phone number, where you can be reached.

Electronic files will only be accepted in PDF format and must be received by 11:59pm Friday, **November 21, 2026**.

Mailed hardcopies must be postmarked by Friday, **November 21, 2026**.

Hand delivered hardcopies must be received by 5:00pm Friday, **November 21, 2026**.

Winning design will be used as inspiration for the 2027 competition pin.

Please note that due to the nature of pin production and converting artistic concepts into workable lapel pins in metal, submitted designs may require minor modifications by Skills Nunavut for the final product.

Submitting design concepts for this contest authorizes Skills Canada Nunavut to produce the winning design for its intended purposes.

Top finalists may be contacted to provide a working file of their design.

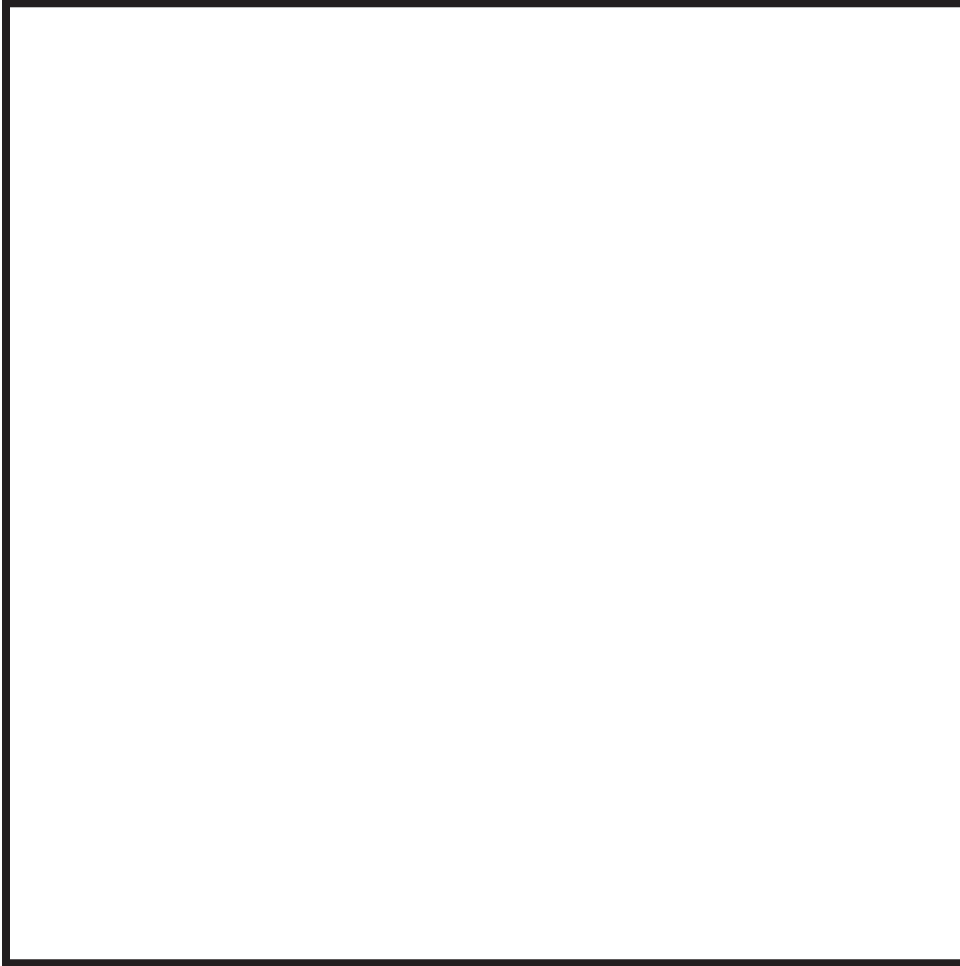
The winning design concept will be reproduced as the official pin of the 2027 Skills Canada Nunavut Territorial Skills Competition.

Mailed hardcopy contest submissions will not be returned.

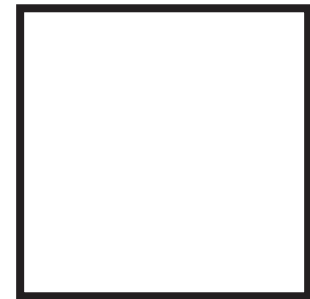
